As you may already have heard, the biggest news at BG recently is that we've changed from a University College to a University - you can read more about this on the next few pages.

Events you can join us for this year include our annual Burns Night Celebration on 25 January, along with a brand new event to BG - The Lincoln Dragon Boat Festival. Raise money for charity and the BG Foundation Fund by getting a team together and joining us at the Brayford Pool.

This year our film screenings at our on-campus cinema The Venue continue to get bigger and better. Particular highlights include the latest James Bond film Skyfall, Argo, and Life of Pi. For more family-friendly fare, you can now visit The Venue on Saturday afternoons for our Family Film Club. We will be showing (amongst other things) Madagascar 3, Frankenweenie, and The Adventures of Tintin - The Secret of the Unicorn. The Venue also remains home to The Lincoln Film Society whose programme of films this year spans over 75 years and 4 continents (www.lincolnfilm.org.uk). Visit one of these continents by taking part in the Lincoln Festival of Japanese Culture taking place in The Venue on 27 January, celebrating art, music, food and more with screenings of Japanese films Akira and Pigs and Battleships.





We are now a University!



Towards the very end of 2012 we got a great Christmas present here at BG - the government approved our application to become a University. Under the old rules, Higher Education Institutions such as ourselves had to have at least 4,000 students to call themselves a University. Those which didn't were referred to as University Colleges. Now the government has changed the rules by reducing the student threshold to 1,000. This brings the UK regulations in line with practice elsewhere in the world, where small and specialist universities are common. We will now be known simply as Bishop Grosseteste University, and have taken the opportunity to change our logo and branding to reflect this.

We're still keeping with purple as our main corporate colour, but now the logo comprises a mitre shape containing a pair of lions. These are taken from the coat of arms of our namesake Robert Grosseteste, the 12th century Bishop of Lincoln and can be seen on his tomb in the South-East Transept of Lincoln Cathedral.



“2012 has been a very special year for our institution, one in which we have celebrated 150 years of higher education in Lincoln. To be able to take our place alongside other UK universities is a symbolic moment for us which recognises the excellent teaching and research which goes on at BG. Until now there has been confusion among prospective students and employers about what a university college is. We have 150 years of history, we enjoy an excellent reputation and we have awarded our own degrees since 2006, but the university college title has been a brake on our ability to recruit students and secure the recognition our work deserves. Now we will be able to compete with other universities on a level playing field.”



what Director of 2008's *Lion's Den*, Pablo Trapero one of Argentina's most skilled filmmakers returns with a story drawn from the alarming violence on his country's streets. Each year, more than eight thousand people are killed on the road and over a hundred thousand are injured. As a result, a disturbingly large part of the Argentine economy revolves around traffic accidents. Legal vultures swarm hospital waiting rooms, hoping to represent the victims and their families. Pablo Trapero's sixth feature, *Carancho*, immerses us in this murky world.

Sosa (Ricardo Darin) works for a so-called foundation (really a dodgy law firm) that helps traffic victims make insurance claims but keeps the lion's share of the settlements. On the job, Sosa meets Lujan (Martina Gusman), a young doctor trying to chalk up hours working round the clock as an ambulance medic and an emergency room attendant. Tired and sickened by his work, Sosa is eager to attain his license to practice law. His relationship with Lujan seems to signal a brighter future. Trapero depicts an intense world of car crashes, drug addiction, emergency rooms and violence. Sosa is a complex character caught in a moral quagmire, while Lujan keeps her own dark secrets. Sosa wants to make a break with his past and do the right thing with Lujan's help, but the walls of corruption reinforced by the doctors, lawyers and policemen who serve to protect a system – present a seemingly insurmountable barrier.

At its centre is the lonely, lugubrious morgue attendant, Mario, carrying out his duties with grim efficiency. He fantasizes about, and for one night sleeps with, his neighbour, the neurotic and equally disturbed Nancy. Once the military seize power, however, people start to disappear from the streets and their homes at an alarming rate – including Nancy – and corpses build up at the morgue. Soon the full horror of the nation's descent into barbarity becomes all too apparent. The film boasts an exceptional lead performance, intense and chilling, and is enhanced by its brooding photography that casts an appropriately cadaverous hue over proceedings.


Lincoln Film Society Turns 60!


