PRIMARY EDUCATION WITH QTS.



Have you been taught by someone who has truly inspired you? Are you ready to pass your knowledge and enthusiasm on to children to help shape their futures? This course will provide you with an integrated academic and professional preparation for teaching, leading to Qualified Teacher Status.

Our course team will work with you to enhance and develop your understanding of learning and teaching. You'll spend a significant

amount of time in school throughout the course, and will be encouraged and supported as you learn to develop effective ways to teach the whole primary curriculum. You will explore the theory and practice of primary education and develop a personal philosophy that will underpin all that you seek to achieve with the children you teach.

Initially you'll work with small groups of children, progressing on to working with a whole class, leading up to

assessed school placements in your second and third years where you'll take full responsibility for whole classes of children.

Our course is organised into six strands: core subjects, foundation subjects, research, placement, critical thinking and professional skills to ensure you are well prepared to teach during each of the placements, and to prepare you for your future career in the classroom.

You'll study six modules in year one which will help you to begin to reflect on the nature of learning and teaching. They will introduce you to the requirements of the national curriculum, classroom management (behaviour, assessment, planning, SEN and Inclusion), the core subjects of the primary curriculum (English, Mathematics, Science), along with the foundation subjects. You will also spend time working with children both at the university and in school.

In your second and third years, you will specialise in one age phase – 3-7, 5-9 or 7-11. The modules in year two build on and extend understandings developed in the first year of the course, with a particular emphasis on issues relating to child development, research, subject specialism, the global classroom and SEN and

Inclusion. You will also widen your school experience, perhaps by visiting multicultural and special schools, as well as undertaking more extensive, solo placements focusing on your chosen age range.

Your third year will help you to prepare for your NQT year and beyond. There are six modules in the final year, which all build further on the six strands that you will have already studied in year one and year two. The research module, where you are able to develop a small piece of research in an area of interest to you, is one that students particularly enjoy. Your final school placement provides the opportunity to take on responsibility for a whole class. At the end of the course, you will undertake a three week transitional placement to further develop your school based knowledge and skills.

On completion of your degree, with your Qualified Teacher Status, you'll be fully equipped with the skills and knowledge to work as a primary school teacher.

OUR TEACHING METHODS

There is no one-size-fits-all method of teaching at BGU - we shape our methods to suit each subject and each group, combining the best aspects of traditional university teaching with innovative techniques to promote student participation and interactivity.

You will be taught in a variety of ways, from lectures, tutorials and seminars, to practical workshops, coursework and work-based placements. Small group seminars and workshops will provide you with an opportunity to review issues raised in lectures, and you will also be expected to carry out independent study.

Placements are a key part of degree study at BGU. They provide an enriching learning experience for you to apply the skills and knowledge you will gain from your course and, in doing so, give valuable real-world experience to boost your career.



WHAT YOU WILL STUDY.

ASSESSMENT

We recognise that individuals come from a wide range of backgrounds and experiences, so we use a variety of assessment strategies on our courses. In our Primary Education with QTS course, there are a variety of assessment methods which are spread out throughout the academic year. These include presentations, essays, group discussions, and a research report. All of these individual assessments allow you to reflect on your practice and theory as you evidence your learning.

LEARNING SUPPORT

Studying at BGU is a student-centred experience. Staff and students work together in a friendly and supportive atmosphere as part of an intimate campus community. You will know every member of staff personally and feel confident approaching them for help and advice, and staff members will recognise you, not just by sight, but as an individual with unique talents and interests. We will be there to support you, personally and academically, from induction to graduation, and beyond.



At BGU, you can study Primary Education with QTS as a single honours degree, giving you an in-depth knowledge of the subject. You may study some or all of the modules on the following pages in Primary Education with QTS.

OUR MODULES.

FIRST YEAR

Introducing the Core Subjects

This module will introduce you to the core subjects of the curriculum, focusing on both subject and pedagogical knowledge. On successful completion of this module you will be able to demonstrate knowledge of the underlying concepts and principles associated with teaching and learning in the core subjects, and evaluate the appropriateness of different approaches to developing concepts in the core subjects.

Introducing the Foundation Subjects

You will be expected to develop subject knowledge alongside practical skills and positive attitudes, with regard to foundation subjects and Religious Education. You will develop a knowledge of planning and assessment, together with an understanding of how to apply a range of different teaching approaches.

Child Development

This module focuses on issues of child development and the theories and research, both long-established and recent, which inform them. You will be supported in your ability to search for, read, understand and use academic literature in your written work.

Introductory Placement

A short school experience focussed on observation early in the year runs alongside university based sessions which will enable you to explore the importance of key aspects of teaching and learning in a professional setting with the support of other trainees. The Introductory Placement later in the year introduces you to planning and teaching and is normally a paired, 5 week school placement, with the addition of a preparation week also at the school.

Learning to Learn

This module is designed to introduce you to theories of learning and to support you in learning to reflect with developing criticality, to support your own academic writing in other modules. This will enable you to develop new, and enhance existing skills; providing opportunities to grow as a writer and researcher and allowing you to consider relevant seminal and current education practice.

Becoming a Teacher

In this module, you will develop your understanding of the role of a teacher and the professional attributes this requires. There will also be an introduction to professional skills (such as planning and assessment) and you will begin to consider how to adapt teaching to meet the needs of all learners, in particular those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

Introductory School Placement

This module aims to prepare you for teaching in a primary school. A short school experience focussed on observation early in the year runs alongside university based sessions which will enable you to explore the importance of key aspects of teaching and learning in a professional setting with the support of other students.

SECOND YEAR

Planning for the Core

This module will further develop your subject and pedagogical knowledge in the core subjects. You will be expected to take responsibility for identifying and developing your needs, with a particular focus taken on different approaches to planning in the core.

Global Education

During the study of this module you will build on your knowledge of foundation subjects and religious education, and consider global aspects of learning. You will explore a range of approaches to teaching and learning, considering different cultural contexts.

OUR MODULES. (CONT)

Beginning to Research

This module will introduce you to the processes of conducting your own research, including ethics and a range of methods commonly used in education. It will see you working together in groups with other students, supported by a tutor.

Developing a Placement

This module runs in conjunction with SCH005 for those students aiming to complete the programme with recommendation for QTS. It comprises a solo school placement, usually of 6 weeks, in your chosen age phase, where you will develop your knowledge, understanding and application within that age phase.

Perspectives on Learning

You will build on your academic writing skills and will investigate a range of differing perspectives on learning. You will also have the opportunity to explore a variety of approaches to teaching, examining the effectiveness of each of these, as well as exploring relevant issues - for example, the use of social media as a teaching tool - and their impact in the classroom.

Inclusive Practice

This module focuses on inclusive teaching and learning, in particular meeting the needs of pupils with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND). You will enhance your knowledge of specific SEND, learning how to adapt your practice to promote the inclusion of all pupils (including considering the inclusion of pupils with English as an Additional Language and those with other identified needs).

Developing School Placement

You will complete this module if you are aiming towards recommendation for QTS. It comprises a solo school placement, usually of 6 weeks, in your chosen age phase, allowing you to develop your knowledge, understanding and application in that age phase.

FINAL YEAR

Directions in the Core

This module continues to develop your understanding of teaching and learning in the core subjects but expands to consider national and international perspectives, contemporary and alternative approaches. You will be expected to draw on what you have learned to articulate and justify your own beliefs about teaching and learning in the core.

Subject Leadership

During the course of this module you will explore aspects of leadership in the primary school, exploring further in relation to individual subjects. You will consider the role of a subject leader and how this can be undertaken effectively.

Research Project

This module builds on previous experience with research and will see you conducting individual research projects in education. You will design your own study, formulating questions, choosing appropriate methods for the methodology, collecting and analysing data, and taking responsibility for ethical practice.

Extending Placement

This module runs in conjunction with SCH006 for those students aiming to complete the programme with recommendation for QTS. It comprises a solo school placement, usually of 7 weeks, in your chosen age phase, where you will develop your knowledge, understanding and application within that age phase.

Critical Thinking

Explore aspects of critical thinking relating to current issues in education, such as obesity amongst younger children, as well as looking forward to future career directions. You will consider your wider role in the school environment and your transition from student to teacher, examining how this can be undertaken effectively.

Extending School Placement

You will complete this module if you are aiming towards recommendation for QTS. It comprises a solo school placement, usually of 7 weeks, in your chosen age phase, allowing you to develop your knowledge, understanding and application in that age phase.

CAREERS AND EMPLOYABILITY.

WHAT OUR STUDENTS THINK.



I really enjoyed the first year of my course. We got to experience working in lots of different schools and were given exciting projects, including writing a children's story book based on the interests of a child we'd worked with. Presenting the final stories to the children was great - we turned their classroom into locations from the stories!

This year I've been on placements in a range of different schools, including specialised Special Educational Needs and multi-cultural schools. During my recent placement I had to teach 80% of the curriculum. Placements can be challenging because not only are they all very different, but we're encouraged to take on a level of responsibility similar to a full-time teacher.

BGU is definitely helping me to meet my future goals. The course provides me with a recommendation for Qualified Teacher Status which means that after my three years at BGU I can go straight into a school, undertake my NQT year and then be a fully qualified teacher. BGU was the best choice for this degree. In fact, in my most recent placement the staff were really impressed that I was studying teaching at BGU. To find out it's viewed in such a high regard within the teaching profession was brilliant - wherever you go it's well known.

The lecturers on my course are amazing and really supportive. TEACHING EXCELLENCE.

Our teaching has been awarded the highest possible rating in the first ever Government-led Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) assessment, a rating which was awarded to just the top 26% of universities in the UK. This shows that you will receive the same high standard of education at BGU as you would at other leading universities such as Cambridge and Oxford.

EMPLOYABILITY.

BGU has consistently high employability rates. Currently over 98% of our students are in work or further study within 6 months of graduating. Of course, we think our students are fantastic from the minute they arrive on campus, but we aim to offer as much support as we can throughout their time here in order to help make them as employable as possible.

Our courses are tailored to help prepare you for life after graduation. This could be through placements in settings relevant to your field, or through one-to-one support time offered within the university.
