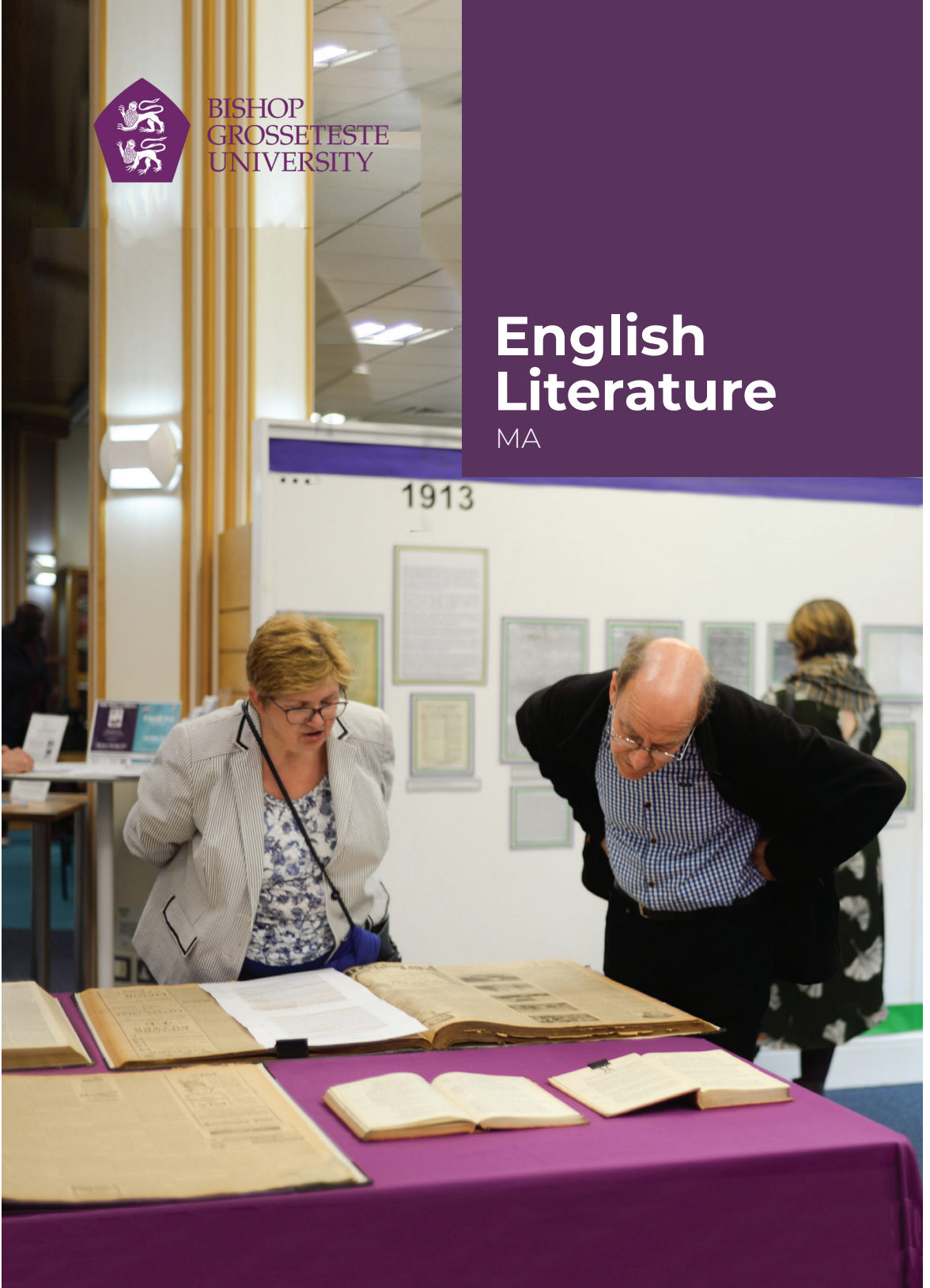

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MA English Literature at BGU

Our English Literature MA course offers an opportunity to deepen your passion for English literature and engage with the most up-to-date disciplinary debates. Based upon established models of scholarship, this programme moves between the study of single authors, literary genres, thematic threads and literary periods.

A Masters in English Literature at BGU is ideal if you wish to broaden and extend your engagement with English Literature. You will explore a range of literary genres, approaches, and themes within a post-Enlightenment context, from 1780 to the present day. You will gain advanced knowledge of English literature, powers of literary critical analysis, research, independent scholarship, and knowledge transfer through excellent communication skills. The

course will equip you with highly sought-after organisational, project-managing, delivery, liaison, problem-solving, and interaction skills.

You will examine a variety of theories, forms and frameworks which engage with the current debates that shape Literary Studies through research-led modules. Two team-taught modules uncover new and darker sides of literature, as well as innovative ways to interpret the past and the present through different perspectives. Framing Genre, Thematic Threads, The Author in Focus, and Literature in Time are modules studying selected authors, literary periods, genres and themes. You will have the opportunity to pursue your own interests in a variety of written and verbal assignments. The final dissertation gives you the space to push your literary passion further individually.

Modules

Theorising Literature: Critical Frameworks

This module explores the critical frameworks at the core of literary studies by engaging with developing, recent critical frameworks, theories and forms that shape current and future trends in English Literature. It develops and consolidates your awareness of the models of literary critical approaches reinforced by a suite of four 15-credit modules on author, genre, theme, and period-based studies.

Literature in Time

This module focuses on scholarly models based upon periodization, historical context and concepts of the literary 'moment'. It explores how texts and subjects are embedded in the historical 'moment', and investigates how period-based approaches reflect upon literature's relationship to the past. It has an oral form of assessment that is designed to develop confident presentation and enhanced communication skills.

Framing Genre

You will focus on scholarly models based upon the concept of the literary genre. It explores how literary texts and subjects are understood through frameworks of shared literary forms and traditions. Through its compact form, the written assignment is designed to develop the effective and concise articulation of a logical and coherent argument.

The Dark Side of Literature

This research-led module explores contemporary debates across a breadth of transgressive literary genres and subjects, potentially including the Gothic, criminality, monstrosity, dystopian and science fiction. Rather than focusing on a single period of literature, genre or subject, it engages with a range of challenging and controversial debates at the forefront of current scholarship.

The Author in Focus

This module focuses upon scholarly models defined through authorship. It studies the oeuvre of a single author, reflecting upon the ideas and literary techniques that inform their work. Through a variety of approaches, it will widen and deepen your understanding of an author's career development and literary reputation.

Thematic Threads

In this module you will focus on literary models based upon a thematic critical approach. It explores how disparate literary texts, authors, genres, and periods are connected through thematic threads. Through its compact form, the written assignment is designed to develop the effective and concise articulation of a logical and coherent argument.

Dissertation

The dissertation represents the culmination of the MA degree programme. Developing from the scholarly frameworks established by prior modules, this module gives you the opportunity to undertake an extensive piece of independent research based upon a topic of your choosing. It builds on the knowledge and skills acquired throughout the programme and challenges you to demonstrate your capacity for sustained research, scholarly evaluation and critical positioning, and high level academic production.

What we offer

Delivery

Throughout this course, you will be offered individual, independent modules delivered through a flexible timetable (which can also accommodate a part-time study route). It provides diversity in both content and structure, with longer modules offering breadth and scope, complemented by specialist modules providing depth and focus. You will be able to tailor the assessment according to your own interests and produce your individual dissertation.

Assessment

Teaching will be based on independent research tasks feeding into regular small group seminar sessions. Through a combination of expert commentary and critical discussion, students will acquire the skills and frameworks required for

a range of oral, written and research-oriented assessments. These literary assessments will develop advanced communication and presentation skills for a multiplicity of professional future.

Support

Studying at BGU is a student-centred experience. Staff and students work together in a friendly and supportive atmosphere as part of an intimate campus community. You will know every member of staff personally and feel confident approaching them for help and advice, and staff members will recognise you, not just by sight, but as an individual with unique talents and interests. We will be there to support you, personally and academically, from induction to graduation.



Research

This MA is research-inspired. It is designed to capture contemporary disciplinary debates with research-led modules informed by the staff's current interests, publications, and collaborative projects.

English literature has an established research culture and postgraduates will be invited to join our staff at regular literary events, workshops, and presentations. Students will be encouraged to participate in the Research Seminar Series and other literary

events, all of which will be scheduled to coincide with MA teaching days.

In the 2014 Research Excellence Framework, 83% of the work submitted by English staff was judged to be of 'international' quality, including research that was deemed 'world leading' in its originality. The team publishes on Tennyson, Blake, Victorian and contemporary women writers, Romantic and Gothic literature, visual culture, travel and life writing, intergenerational intellectual legacy, British fiction of the 1980s and Thatcherism.



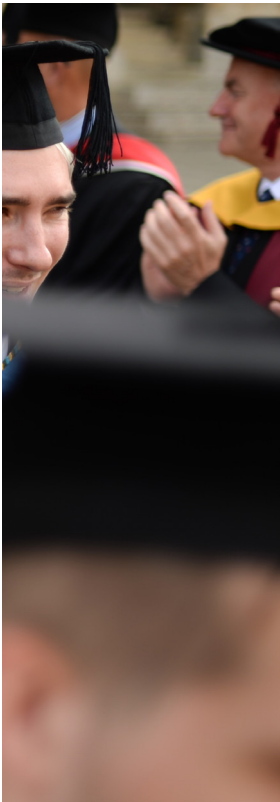


Your future
